

CPCCOHS1001A Work Safely in the Construction Industry

Program Overview

This program develops basic skills and knowledge of relevant workplace health and safety requirements, obligations and risk management strategies. The program is a requirement of the Workplace Health and Safety Act 1995. It is designed as a preparatory program for people intending to undertake construction-type work. However, those already undertaking these work activities will also be required to complete the program.

What will I study?

Appropriate legislative requirements and responsibilities, basic concepts of workplace health and safety plans and work method statements, physical building and construction hazards, basic risk management concepts and emergency procedures.

The course will be delivered / assessed in the same unique holistic approach as is used for all BOSS Institute of Advanced Technology (BIAT) courses. Participants will be involved in activities such as group discussion, individual questioning and written assessment and scenario solving. The subject matter will be relevant to the building and construction environment across a number of trade activities.

What are the entry requirements?

There is no specific entry requirement and anyone can enroll in this program particularly those commencing or continuing work in the building and construction industry.

How much will this course cost?

When does the course begin?

We are delivering courses as required and anticipate that weekly late afternoon/night courses will be the norm. The next course date can be obtained from our office.

How long will this course take?

This course will run over four hours.

What materials/equipment do I need?

You will need to provide some stationery. BIAT will provide a Workbook and Resource Kit as part of the course.

What will I receive?

On successful completion of this program you will receive a Statement of Attainment. You will also be issued with General Safety Induction Card ('White Card').

Can I apply for credit transfer or RPL?

Credit Transfer may give you advanced standing (exemption) for parts of the course that you have successfully completed through other Registered Training Organisations or other courses.

Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) is available where an applicant may have attained the skills and knowledge equivalent to specific competencies through previous training, work experience or life experiences. We will automatically assess you in this area when you enrol.

What about Special assistance?

The BOSS Institute has identified qualified teachers to provide support in the areas of Language, Literacy and Numeracy assistance, Disability Assistance and general Learning Support. Your teacher in conjunction with these teachers will assess your Language, Literacy and Numeracy needs as well as arranging provision of learning support should you need it.
