

BCG10103 Certificate I in General Construction

Program Overview

This course is specifically designed to meet the requirements of schools and industry. The course involves 'face to face' training by our experienced instructors who are all practicing tradespersons and/or builders. Whilst the course has a practical focus, it is designed to broaden the student's awareness of the over 70 careers available in the building and construction industry.

In addition, students have the unique opportunity to visit the BOSS Home Display Centre and its over 100 exhibitors along with work experience on a BOSS Corporation building site.

What will I study?

The course studies a number of competencies from the BCG03 national training package in general construction.

These competencies will be delivered in a project based, holistically presented manner that ensures that the students understand the practical requirements of industry and develop the employability skills to make them job ready.

The Institute is also part of the Doorways to Construction (D2C) program which is managed by Construction Training Queensland and is a partnership with Education Queensland.

What are the entry requirements?

Students as low as Year 10 can enroll in this program, there are no special entry requirements.

However, students will be expected to be motivated towards gaining a career in the construction industry.

Where can I study?

At the BOSS Institute of Advanced Technology (BIAT) Campus at Burleigh Heads or at individual school campuses.

How much will this course cost?

An estimate of costs can be provided on request, but fees will only be confirmed when you enroll.

When does the course begin?

We are delivering courses as required and the mode of delivery can be negotiated to suit school timetables.

How long will this course take?

The course is over 200 nominal hours but delivery mode can be negotiated. However, the minimum commitment required would be one day/week or a block of at least one term.

How do I apply?

What materials/equipment do students need?

BIAT will provide a Workbook and Resource Kit and Sample Bag of information from the BOSS Home Display Centre exhibitors as part of the course. Students would be expected to provide personal protective equipment (PPE).

What will I receive?

On successful completion of this program you will receive a Certificate I in General Construction that is nationally recognised. The course is also structured to maximize Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE) points and many of the competencies articulate directly to a Certificate III (trade) course.

Can I apply for credit transfer or RPL?

Credit Transfer may give you advanced standing (exemption) for parts of the course that you have successfully completed through other Registered Training Organisations or other courses.

Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) is available where an applicant may have attained the skills and knowledge equivalent to specific competencies through previous training, work experience or life experiences. We will automatically assess you in this area when you enroll.

What about Mutual Recognition?

BIAT will recognise any Australian Qualification Framework Qualification and / or Statement of Attainment issued by any other Registered Training Organisation.

What about Special assistance?

The BOSS Institute has identified qualified teachers to provide support in the areas of Language, Literacy and Numeracy assistance, Disability Assistance and general Learning Support. Your teacher in conjunction with these teachers will assess your Language, Literacy and Numeracy needs as well as arranging provision of learning support should you need it.

Code of Practice?
